### **Evaluation Methods Used:**

During the testing process of this website, the team made use of multiple evaluation methods, including both automated (WAVE, TPGi Color Contrast Analyzer, axe, HTML Validator) and manual testing in Chrome and Firefox on Windows 11. A major part of the process included the use of assistive technology (JAWS and NVDA) to assess conformance with WCAG 2.0/2.1 criteria.

This report was provided by accessiBe Ltd.

#### **Description:**

The testing process was carried out in compliance with the WCAG 2.1 AA guidelines. The product was found to be overall partially supportive.
